

TECHNICAL BULLETIN SCHEDULE D – OFF ROAD APPAREL

RATIONALE:

To permit the use of two piece race suits subject to seeking individual exemption and granting of approval from and by the Australian Off Road Commission.

AUTHORITY:

This amendment was approved by the Australian Off Road Commission via e-mail vote 16th February 2007.

ACTION:

Amend Schedule D – Apparel (d) Off Road as follows;

Schedule D

(d) Off Road:

During all Off Road competition, all crew members are required to wear:

- one-piece driving suits made from flame retardant material. **Alternatively, a specific exemption may be provided for individuals to wear a two piece suit complying with an appropriate SFI Standard upon application the Australian Off Road Commission. In such cases the CAMS approval document must be provided at scrutiny and upon request from the organiser;**
- boots complying with current FIA standards, the upper portions of which are made from materials compliant with ISO 6940, or alternatively boots which incorporate a full leather upper;
- socks made from materials complying with ISO 15025:2000 or ISO 6940, or alternatively of cotton or wool.

It is recommended that a separate balaclava, t-shirt and underwear all made from a material complying with ISO 15025:2000 or ISO 6940, or alternatively of cotton or wool, be worn.
